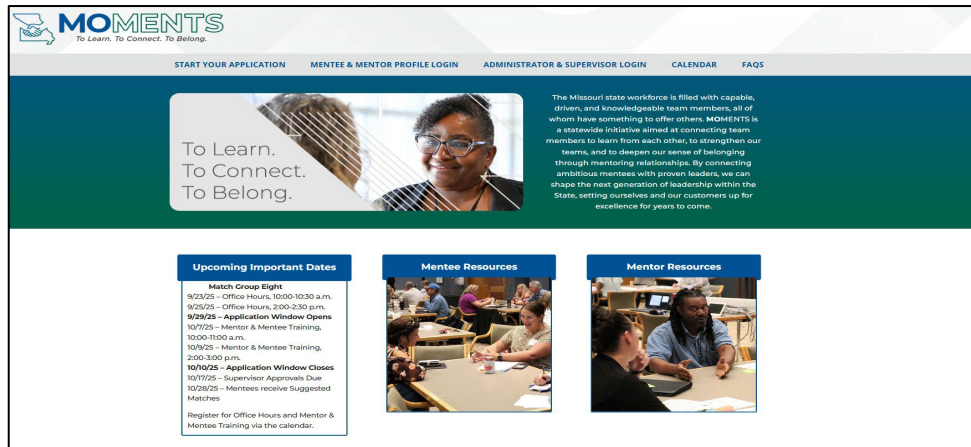
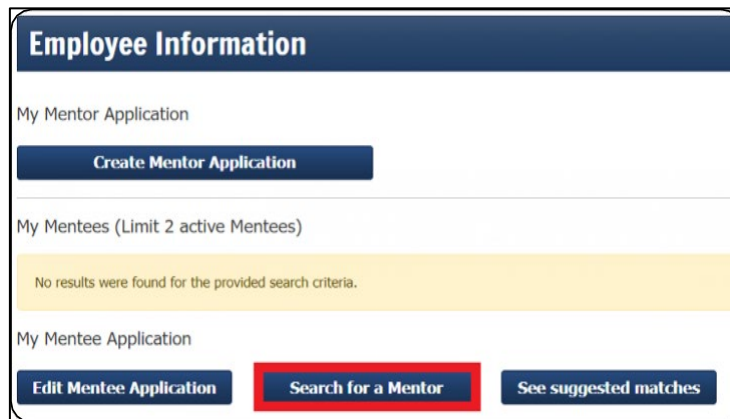


Searching for a Mentor

1. Visit MOMENTS.mo.gov. Click the “**Mentee & Mentor Profile Login**” button on the top banner.



2. In the Employee Information screen under the My Mentee Application section, click the ‘**Search for a Mentor**’ button.



3. You will arrive at the **Mentor Search** screen as shown below. Here you can filter your search by the mentor's name, working hours, agency, division, career skills, and/or soft skills.
